- 1. What is the essence of the visions of Daniel? What does Daniel clarify in his prophecies?
 - The essence of the visions of Daniel is that whilst there will be days of severe persecution and afflictions, God's side will ultimately win, and the Kingdom of God will be established. (1 mark)
 - Prophesy of Daniel gives <u>hope and comfort to those people who suffer</u> <u>from slavery and severe persecution.</u> (.5 marks)
 - He reaffirms that <u>those who trust in God, despite severe persecution, will</u> be saved and reinstated by God in the end. (.5 marks)
- 2. List down the four remarkable significances of 'skull hill' in the Holy Bible?

(0.5 marks for each point)

- It is believed that the skull of Adam lay buried there.
- Melchizedek offered sacrifice.
- Abraham built an altar to sacrifice Isaac.
- David offered sacrifices at this place.



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- 3. Who was Pilate? why did he come to Jerusalem? What was the guilt the Jews raised against Jesus before Pilate? (0.5 marks for each point)
 - Pilate was the Governor of Judea.
 - He came to Jerusalem to look after the law and order during the festival.

The guilt the Jews raised against Jesus before Pilate were:

- Jesus taught not to pay tax to Caesar (Roman Emperor)
- Jesus declared himself a King.
- 4. What were the powers, duties and promise that Jesus gave his disciples?

The additional powers, duties and promise that Jesus had granted his disciples were:

• Make disciples of all nations.

- (0.5 marks for each point)
- Baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- Teach them to obey the commandments of Jesus.
- The great promise that Jesus gave to the Apostles was, "I am with you always, to the end of the age."
- 5. What is Mulanthuruthy Padiyola? How it was formed?

(0.5 marks for each point)

- A democratic administrative system under spiritual leadership came into existence in the church, after the Holy Synod of Mulanthuruthy.
- The minutes of the decisions of the Holy synod was recorded and undersigned by all the members who attended the meeting.
- A copy of the same was submitted to His Holiness and another copy was kept at the Headquarters of the Church.
- An affidavit (a written statement confirmed by oath) recording all these decisions were submitted by the members of the Church to His Holiness. This famous document is known as the Mulanthuruthy Padiyola.



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VI. WRITE LONG ANSWERS

 $(answer\ ANY\ TWO\ only(2\ x\ 5=10\ Marks)$

1. How is Messiah presented in Ezekiel's prophesy?

Messiah is presented mainly in three ways.

1. The cedar tree planted on high and lofty mountain:

(1 mark for each point)

- a) A tender sprout of a cedar tree will be planted on a high and lofty mountain of Israel.
- b) It will produce boughs and bear fruits and would become a noble cedar.
- c) Under it every kind bird will live and in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. This denotes the supremacy of Messiah.
- 2. The real heir of the Ruler-
- d) 'Until He comes whose right it is to him, I will give it. This denotes that Messiah will come as the real ruler.
- 3. The True Shepherd –
- e) "I will judge between sheep and sheep. I will set up over them one shepherd" The prophet states that <u>Israel</u>, the flock will be safe <u>under Jesus Christ</u>, the <u>True Shepherd</u>.
- 4. How does one believer prepare oneself before receiving the Holy Eucharist?

(1 mark for each point)

- a. The communicant must prepare themselves from the previous day to receive the Holy Eucharist.
- b. They must complete all the canonical prayers and should reach the church earlier, to attend all the prayers.



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- c. Before receiving the Eucharist, one must confess before the priest, if they felt that they have committed a sin.
- d. Once confessed it is not necessary to do confession for the next 40 days. However, if one has committed any sin within these 40 days, he must undergo confession before accepting the Eucharist. One must receive atonement for that sin before receiving the Eucharist.
- e. So those who need no confession, must receive atonement prayers (Hoosoyo prayers) from the priest before the Holy Qurbana. All the faithful should take a confession once in 40 days before accepting the Eucharist.
- 5. Explain the celebration of the Passover Feast and the institution of the Holy Qurbana

(1 mark for each point)

- a. Jesus entrusted Peter and John with certain instructions to prepare the Passover Feast. They did accordingly.
- b. The Passover feast was prepared at the Mansion of Mark. They ate the Passover meal in accordance with the Law (Exodus 12).
- c. There was a dispute among the disciples as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest.
- d. Jesus washed the feet of the disciples like a servant. Thus, Jesus illustrated the model of humility and service.
- e. After completing the observance of the Passover feast according to the Law, Jesus instituted the Holy Qurbana



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6. Prove that the trial of Jesus was unlawful

(1 mark for each point) ANY FIVE points

Jesus faced a trial without any natural Justice. All decisions were not only one-sided but was also conducted contrary to the Laws of the Jews and the Romans. Justice was denied to Jesus in the following ways:

- a. Jesus was condemned to death even before they questioned him.
- b. False witnesses were produced, and the statements of the witnesses were accepted even though these proofs were not verified.
- c. Jesus was not given any opportunity for self-defense.
- d. It is unlawful for the Sanhedrin to meet at night.
- e. They not only put Jesus under oath, but when He answered, they used his own reply to judge him.
- f. Whilst Sanhedrin should only meet in their office adjacent to the temple and trial could be conducted only there, in the case of Jesus, they met at the house of the High Priest.
- g. It was unlawful to pronounce judgment on the same day of the trial and but in this case also they broke their own law and pronounced judgement on the same day.
