- Jews believed that salvation is their right and nobody else had any right to it. But the book of Jonah gives a fitting reply to this narrow mindedness.
- The book of Jonah gives us the message that God's mercy has no boundaries and all people are the children of God like Jews and that God desires to give salvation to all.

VI. WRITE LONG ANSWERS

1. Why did the theologians consider the book of Isaiah as a miniature Bible?

- The book of Isaiah has 66 chapters same as the total books in the Bible.
- The <u>first 39 chapters</u> are prophesied about the <u>punishment for idolatry</u> and <u>injustice</u>. This is compared to the 39 books in the Old Testament.
- The last <u>27 chapters are messages of salvation</u>. Isaiah gives hope that the <u>Lord will come</u> and <u>save</u> the whole <u>of mankind by removing all the sins</u> <u>of mankind through the cross</u>. It is similar to the <u>27 books in the New Testament</u>.
- Isaiah <u>concludes</u> his prophecies by <u>giving hope of a new earth</u> and a <u>new heaven</u> in his last chapter (66). We can see <u>this hope also in the Book of Revelations</u> which is the last book in the New Testament.
- Some theologians are of the opinion that the prophecies of Isaiah were written in two periods. According to them, the <u>first 1-39 chapters of the book were written before the Babylon exile</u> and chapters <u>40-66 were written during the exile</u>. This again gives a <u>similarity to the division of the Bible</u> as <u>Old Testament & New Testament in relation to Christ</u>.

2. Compare the vision of Christ by St. Matthew and St Luke?

- St Matthew revealed Jesus as the new Moses and teacher Like <u>Moses</u> who gave them the Commandments of God at Mount Sinai, <u>Jesus through</u> the Sermon on Mount teaches these Laws in their fullness.
- St Matthew also portrays Jesus as Messiah, the King: In this Gospel, Jesus is depicted as Messiah the King, the hope of Israel. There are 40 quotations from the Old Testament to prove that Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Law and prophecies.
- St Luke gives importance to the fact that <u>Jesus came for the salvation of</u> the entire humanity, and not for the chosen races.
- St Luke has written the Gospel giving emphasis to the love and compassion that Jesus had for the humble and poor. It is made clear that Jesus was the true Son of Man, who was sympathetic to the sorrows and sufferings of the sinners and offered them the invaluable gift of salvation.
- St Luke also establishes, through the <u>parables</u> of <u>lost sheep</u>, <u>lost coin</u>, and lost son, that Jesus is the perfect Man who came in search of sinners

3. Describe the contributions of St James to the Church through his writings?

- St James also known as the <u>flute of the Holy Spirit</u> has decorated the <u>prayers of the church</u> with his <u>poems</u> and <u>supplications</u>.
- He had written <u>760 poems of prayer</u>, copied by <u>70 copywriters</u>.
- He had also written many <u>moral letters based on practicality rather</u> than principles.
- His <u>poetic writings</u> include <u>treatises</u> on the great <u>men of the Old</u>
 <u>Testament</u>, of <u>Angels</u>, the <u>mysteries of the Son of God</u>, <u>moral lessons for festivals</u>, <u>sermons</u>, <u>funeral orations</u>, <u>hymns codifying biographies</u>, and many others.
- He has also <u>written two books on Baptism</u> rites and the <u>biographies on</u>

4. Pen on the two circumambulations (Pradakshinam) in the Good Friday service.

- The first circumambulation (Pradakshinam) in Good Friday observance is <u>conducted after 3rd hour prayers.</u>
- It starts by going out through the southern door of the church, moving westwards, completing one revolution and entering the church through the northern door. Umbrellas and flags are not permitted in this circumambulation.
- It symbolises the journey of Jesus to Golgotha carrying the cross.
- The second <u>circumambulation is conducted after the cross-adoration</u> service.
- This also leaves the church through the southern door and after completing one circuit around the church, enters the church through the northern door. Black umbrellas and flags that shows grief are permitted for this circumambulation.
- It commemorates the carrying of the body of Jesus for burial by Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus.
