- 1. What did Jesus want the wealthy young man to do? Why did he has to go back disappointed? (1mark for each point)
 - Jesus wanted the rich young man to sell his possessions, give it to the poor and then to follow Jesus.
 - The young man had to go back disappointed as he was not prepared to give up his wealth. He considered his wealth more precious than everlasting life.
- 2. What was the specialty of the Cross that was being used by Mor Gregorious Abdul Jaleel Bava? (2 marks)
 - There were 12 chambers in the cross which was being used by Mor Gregorious Abdul Jaleel Bava. Holy relics of Holy men were enclosed in eleven of the twelve chambers and in the 12th one, a particle of the cross on which Jesus was crucified was enclosed.
- 3. What is the basic difference between the parable of the prodigal son and the other two parables? (Parable of lost sheep and Parable of lost coin) (1 mark for each point)
 - The first two parables (Parable of lost sheep and Parable of lost coin) tells the discovery of lost things and the happiness when they are discovered.
 - But the parable of prodigal son, Jesus depicts the love of God awaiting the coming back of the sinner.
- 4. Why did Naomi decided to go back to the native land? (2 marks)



- 1. Explain the promises and its significance that Jesus has given to Simon Peter?

 Jesus gives two promises to Simon:
 - 1. Jesus says, you are Kepho, and upon this rock I will build my Church. In Syriac, the word Kepho means 'Rock'. We should understand from this; that the Church belongs to the Lord. It is on this rock of firm faith testified by Simon the Lord has built his Church. (1.5 marks)
 - 2. The keys of the kingdom of heaven are entrusted to Peter. The keys signify the authority. Lord has given to Peter; the authorization to bind and loosen; meaning the authority to exonerate from sin. (1 mark)
- 2. Write short note on the Baptism of Jesus (0.5 marks for each point)
 - Jesus received the Baptism from John the Baptist on the bank of river Jordan. when he was 30 years old.



- The baptism obtained by Jesus was not the baptism for atonement that was being given by John the Baptist, because Jesus had no sin by birth or action.
 The baptism that Jesus then received was for the fulfillment of divine righteousness.
- Heaven was opened at the time of baptism of Jesus. The Holy Ghost descended and alighted on him like a dove.
- A voice saying "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." was also heard.
- The disclosure of the father, the son and the Holy Spirit occurred at the moment of baptism of Jesus. Therefore, this feast is also known as Denaha.
- 3. Write **any five** directions that was given by Jesus to the disciples? (0.5 marks for each point)
 - 1. Do not go in the way of gentiles, do not enter the city of Samaritans, go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.
 - 2. Preach that the kingdom of God is at hand
 - 3. Work without remuneration freely you have received, freely give.
 - 4. Only very simple and minimum preparation will be enough.
 - 5. Into whatever city or town ye shall enter, enquire who is worthy and there abide till go thence and do service in that place. Whosoever shall not receive you, when you depart out of that house or city, shake off the dust of your feet.
 - 6. Should have wisdom and innocence for living in the midst of hardhearted Jews.

- 4. Describe the incident how Elijah was taken up to Heaven and Elisha's reaction to it.
 - Elijah and Elisha together went to Bethel, then to Jericho and from there to Jordan. There when they were talking and walking, a Chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated them from each other and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. (1.5 marks)
 - When Elisha saw Elijah climbing up to heaven he cried "Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!." Elisha saw him no more. When Elijah disappeared from his sight Elisha returned to Jordan, carrying the mantle that fell on him from Elijah. (1 mark)
