 Through this, He teaches that everything should be done in a systematic and orderly manner. . (0.75 mark)

- 4. Write briefly about the Lents in the Holy Church. (0.5 marks for each point)

 The Holy Church has 5 Lents.
 - 1) Nineveh Lent or 'Moonu Nombu' remembrance of the fasting and repentance of the people of Nineveh (OR) three days of Lent
 - 2) Great Lent or 'Valiya Nombu' victory of Jesus over Satan after His lent for 40 days (OR) Lent of fifty days
 - 3) Sleeha Lent Lent for 13 days (OR) concludes on 29th June (OR) celebrated in memory of St. Peter and St. Paul.
 - 4) Soonoyo Lent Lent in memory of the assumption of St. Mary (OR) Lent of 15 days (OR) concludes on 15th August.
 - 5) Yeldo Lent Lent in commemoration of the birth of our Lord (OR) observed for 25 days (OR) concludes on 25th December.
