1. Write any three commandments that specify the relation between man and God?

(Any three points – 0.5 mark for each point)

Ans.

1. I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me.
2. You shall not make yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them.
3. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.
4. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.

2. Write any three important incidents, in which Jesus gave sight to the blind?

(Any three points- 0.5 mark for each point)

Ans. 1. The incidents of giving sight to the blind by Jesus are recorded in the Holy Bible.

1. Gives eye sight at Capernaum, by touching the eyes.
2. At Jericho, gives eye sight by touching on eyes.
3. At Bethsaida; gives eyesight by spitting into the eyes of the blind.
4. In Jerusalem; gives eyesight by spitting on the ground, mixing it with mud and spreading on the eyes of the man, who was born blind from birth.

3. Name four Holy fathers in the Christian Church who suffered tortures and became martyrs?

(1.5 marks)

Ans. St. Ignatius Noorono, Mor Clemis of Rome, Mor Polycarpus of Smirna and Mor Iranianus were the four Holy Fathers who suffered torture for the expansion of the Holy Church.

1. What were the services done by Emperor Constantine to the Holy Church?

- a) It was with the Milan proclamation by Emperor Constantine in AD 313 that the persecution against the Christian Church came to an end. **(1mark)**
- b) The Christian Church became the Royal Church and he brought about several rules, laws and reforms favorable to the church. **(0.5 mark)**
- c) Sunday was declared as public holiday. **(0.5 mark)**
- d) The priests were exempted from taxes. **(0.5 mark)**

2. a) What was the rule of Jews regarding payment of temple tax?

b) What are the messages that we learn from the lesson "The Fish that gave coin"?

- a) According to the law, any Jew above twenty years of age had to pay a shekel for the needs in the temple. **(1 mark)**

3. a) What is the purpose of observance of the Great Lent?

b) What is the procedure of observance of the Lents?

a) Great Lent or 'Valiya Nombu' – This lent recalls the victory of our Lord Jesus over Satan after His lent for 40 days. 10 days lent is also observed in continuation of the 40 days lent. This is also known as Lent of fifty days. **(1 mark)**

b) The procedure of observance of the Lents should be with: **(0.5 mark for each point)**

- i. Restrictions in food with fasting and prayers at prescribed times.
- ii. On the days of fasting, the prohibited food items should be avoided.
- iii. We should gain strength in spirit, identifying and confessing our sins and receiving the Holy Eucharist.

4. Briefly describe the books of the Pentateuch. (one sentence each)

(a) **Genesis** is the first book of the Pentateuch. It means beginning or birth or origin.

It describes the origin of everything. **(0.5 mark)**

(b) **Exodus** - means journey or setting out. Describes the journey of the Israelites from Egypt to Canaan. **(0.5 mark)**

(c) **Leviticus** - is the third book in the Pentateuch and deals with worship, orders and procedures/deals with the tribe of Levi. **(0.5 mark)**

(d) **Numbers** - is the fourth book in the Old Testament and is part of the Pentateuch/deals with the census of Israelites to find Israelites above 20 years, fit for fighting / tells about the history of Israel for 40 years from Mount Sinai till Moab, near Canaan. **(0.5 mark)**

(e) **Deuteronomy** - is the fifth book of the Pentateuch; also called the repetition of law or 'repeated law'. Important rules were stressed, and those that needed explanations were explained. **(0.5 mark)**
